Welcome to Hampstead Theatre, the home of original and entertaining new work. Since 1959, our simple mission was to create original theatre without creative restriction. We quickly attracted a generation of talent that helped to redefine British Theatre. From Harold Pinter testing out his early plays to the likes of Mike Leigh, Michael Frayn, Abi Morgan, Rona Munro, Shelagh Stephenson – original thinkers, every one.

Our mission has not changed. We see ourselves as part of a rich tradition that stretches back to the age of Shakespeare. A tradition that mixes craftsmanship with entrepreneurship. Commercial success with critical acclaim. And a creative eye that seeks out variety – from Olivier Award winning musicals like Sunny Afternoon to mould-breaking plays like The Arrest of Ai Weiwei, The Intelligent Homosexual's Guide to Capitalism and Socialism with a Key to the Scriptures, Good People, Wonderland and Chariots of Fire. We were the first to turn a theatre into an Olympic stadium.

Our state of the art auditoriums (Main Stage and our intimate Downstairs studio) allows our writers, actors, directors maximum creative flexibility. JOB DESCRIPTION

Job title: DEPUTY HEAD OF LIGHTING

Reports to: HEAD OF LIGHTING

Hampstead's production team prides itself on fulfilling the expectations and requirements of each performance at Hampstead Theatre and delivering the highest production values.

The Deputy Head of Lighting, in support of the Head of Lighting, helps meet the creative requirements of artistic teams using theatre resources in a flexible and efficient way, as well as operating shows and programming for lighting designers.

OVERALL RESPONSIBILITIES

PRODUCTION

Under the direction of the Head of Lighting:

- Facilitating, overseeing and realising the electrical requirements for all productions including lighting as required by directors and designers.
- Overseeing and undertaking rigging and focussing of lighting equipment.
- Attending production meetings, rehearsals, technical rehearsals, get-ins, get-outs and performances as required.
- Assisting and running rigs and de-rigs upstairs and downstairs.
- Liaising with Lighting, Sound and Video designers and Production Managers to create accurate plans and ensure thorough preparation of each production.
- Designing, building and fitting-up electrical effects and practicals as required.
- Programming ETC lighting consoles in both the upstairs and downstairs spaces.
- Originating show roles on a production-by-production basis and producing the relevant paperwork as required.
- Providing constructive feedback about the production process to the Heads' of Lighting, Stage and the Technical Director.
- Deputising for the Head of Lighting in their absence.
- Assisting in other areas of the Production Department as required.

STAFFING

- Assisting the Head of Lighting with recruiting, scheduling and managing of all technical staff.
- Promoting good working practices and maintaining high production values within the electrics team at all times.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- Following Health & Safety in all backstage and onstage areas, adhering to the in-house Health & Safety policy and with Health & Safety regulations generally.
- Contributing to risk assessments for electrics elements of productions and general risk assessments for specific areas of work within the department.
- Servicing stage lanterns, cables, other stage equipment and all electrical and sound equipment, including portable appliances in compliance with Electricity at Work Act and maintaining accurate records thereof.



 Maintaining COSHH, LOLER and any other Health & Safety records relevant to the department as required and directed by the Head of Lighting.

GENERAL

- Ensuring all electrical equipment is appropriately stored, maintained and serviced.
- Carrying out building lamp rounds on a regular basis.
- Assisting in the hiring and lending of the theatre's stock of electrics equipment and keeping accurate records.
- Planning and carrying out minor alterations and improvements to the theatre installation as necessary.
- Ordering new equipment and consumable supplies as necessary in accordance with departmental budget and accounting procedures.
- Ensuring that backstage areas are kept in an appropriate state at all times.

The following responsibilities apply to all Hampstead Theatre staff:

- Participating actively in the life of the theatre
- Complying with Hampstead Theatre's Diversity, Health & Safety, GDPR and other policies at all times.
- Carrying out administrative work generated by the above activities.

This job description is a guide to the nature of the work required of this position. It is neither wholly comprehensive nor restrictive and does not form part of the contract of employment.

- Knowledge and experience of theatre electrics to a high standard.
- Direct experience of lighting rigging and operation.
- Experience in working collaboratively alongside and programming for both upcoming and experienced Lighting Designers.
- Excellent knowledge of ETC Eos series lighting desks and programming ability.
- Good knowledge of lighting networking systems.
- Good electrical knowledge and practical making skills.
- Basic knowledge of current theatrical Sound & Video practices
- Basic moving light repair and maintenance experience.
- Ability to comfortably work at height.
- Awareness of the importance of Health & Safety issues.
- Experience of working with and supporting creative teams.
- Highly organised, with an ability to prioritise and multi-task.
- Flexible, responsive and a team player.
- Good communication skills.
- Ability to interpret and work from technical drawings.
- Ability to remain calm whilst working under pressure.
- Available to work scheduled evenings and weekends.



TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This is a full-time permanent position.

The salary is £31,000 per annum

A normal working week consists of 43-hours, Monday to Saturday. Overtime is payable for hours worked in excess of this and for hours worked on Sundays, Public Holidays and overnight. Regular evening, weekend and overnight work will be required.

During the first three months' probation there will be two weeks' probation, after which the notice period will be eight weeks.

Holiday entitlement is 28 days annual leave plus Public Holidays.
