Job Description: TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Responsible to: Director of Operations & Associate Producer

Responsible for: Head of Lighting, Head of Stage, Deputy Head of Lighting, Deputy Head of

Stage and all casual wardrobe, stage and electrics staff.

Purpose of Post

The Technical Director heads-up Hampstead Theatre's production department and is the first point of contact for enquiries to the production department. The Technical Director supports freelance production managers and creative teams with the realisation of the design for all Hampstead productions, co-productions and visiting productions, advising them of the facilities and resources available at Hampstead Theatre.

The Technical Director is responsible for line managing the production department and for scheduling and rostering according to the building's activity.

Overall Responsibilities as Technical Director

STAFFING

- Line-managing, scheduling, recruiting and supervising all production staff, making best use of their time and keeping an accurate record of hours worked.
- Recruiting Production Managers for all Hampstead shows.
- Approving all timesheets for in-house and casual production staff, including crew, wardrobe, stage managers and actors and ensuring these are processed accurately and quickly and within budget.
- Ensuring the training needs of production staff are reviewed as appropriate, especially with respect to health & safety regulations.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- Implementing and overseeing Health & Safety in all backstage and onstage areas, adhering to the in-house Health & Safety policy and with Health & Safety regulations generally.
- Identifying hazards and completing suitable risk assessments for all production related activities.



- Working with visiting Production Managers to ensure that risk assessments are completed for all productions within the building.
- Ensuring that all Health & Safety maintenance and training records relevant to the department are completed and communicated to staff.
- Ensuring the production process is compliant with CDM regulations.
- Acting as a member of the Health & Safety committee and occasionally chairing meetings.

MAINTENANCE AND DEPARTMENTAL EXPENDITURE

- Ensuring a schedule of maintenance for all stock lighting and stage equipment is inplace.
- Overseeing annual and strategic production department expenditure and ensuring this
 is within the annual budget.
- Developing medium and long-term plans to accommodate Hampstead Theatre's technical requirements.

PRODUCTIONS AND OTHER ACTIVITY

- Liaising with Production Managers on realising all technical aspects of productions and helping to identify cost savings and economies.
- Responding to requests for technical information and support for all Hampstead Theatre activities, both internally and externally.
- Overseeing the scheduling and recruitment of casual staff for productions including wardrobe, stage management, stage and lighting crew.
- Supporting Stage Managers in the carrying out of their duties, especially ensuring they
 are inducted into the building and understand in-house systems and procedures.
- Ensuring all backstage areas are kept tidy and maintained in an appropriate manner.
- Reconciling and monitoring show and departmental expenditure including tracking supplier accounts, credit card expenditure and petty cash claims.



- Delivering all technical aspects of ad hoc events such as fundraising galas and festivals.
- Considering equality, diversity and access in all activities undertaken by the production department.
- Considering how the production department's activities impact the environment and implement improvements to reduce environmental impacts.

The following responsibilities apply to all Hampstead Theatre staff:

- Participating actively in the life of the theatre.
- Complying with Hampstead Theatre's Equal Opportunities, Health & Safety and other policies at all times.
- Carrying out administrative work generated by the above activities.

- Previous experience of production management or heading a stage, electrics, sound or other technical department within a producing theatre environment.
- Thorough knowledge of delivering all aspects of productions.
- Previous experience of working with and supporting creative teams.
- Proven leadership skills, with an ability to encourage and motivate staff.
- Excellent financial skills with previous experience of managing budgets and reconciling expenditure.
- Excellent understanding of relevant Health & Safety legislation, technical standards and CDM regulations with experience carrying out and implementing risk assessments
- Experience drafting with CAD.
- · Highly organised.
- Ability to anticipate and resolve problems.
- Creative thinker.
- Excellent communication skills.
- Able to remain calm whilst working under pressure.
- Available to work evenings and weekends.
- Computer literate.
